Minutes

20-128 Council Member Flanders moved to approve the minutes of the August 3, 2020 City Council meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Jurkas and carried unanimously by roll call vote.

20-129 Consent

Council Member Sladick moved to approve the Consent Agenda consisting of: a) Department Reports for Police, Fire, Public Works, Administrative Services and the Library and b) Designate MML Annual Meeting Representatives. The motion was supported by Council Member Olson and carried unanimously by roll call vote.

20-130 Zoning Board of Appeals – Reappointments

Council Member Jurkas moved to approve the reappointments of Steve Hill, George Maniates and Sherry White to the Zoning Board of Appeals for three-year terms expiring September 1, 2023. The motion was supported by Council Member Sladick and carried unanimously by roll call vote.

20-131 Sole-Source Purchase – Underground Fuel Storage Tank, City Hall

Council Member Beecham moved to approve the purchase and installation of a replacement underground fuel storage tank for City Hall. All work will be completed by Rohr Gasoline Equipment Inc. of Byron Center, Michigan at a quoted price of \$84,000. The motion was supported by Council Member Flanders and carried unanimously by roll call vote.

20-132 Traffic Control Orders – Various Streets

Council Member Sladick moved to approve traffic control orders for the designation of speed limits on: 1) Airport Place, Robert Hunter Drive to Cul-de-sac – maintain 25mph, 2) Airport Service Road, Stariha Drive to Hakes Drive – maintain 25mph, 3) Devin Drive, Grand Haven Road to Cul-de-sac – maintain 25mph, 4) Hackley Health


Boulevard, Harvey Street to Prairie Street – maintain 25mph, 5) Hakes Drive, Airport Service Road to Ellis Road – maintain 25mph, 6) Industrial Road, Grand Haven Road to its east end – maintain 25mph, 7) Paul Court, Ellis Road to Cul-de-sac – maintain 25mph, 8) Prairie Street, Hackley Health Boulevard to Farr Road – maintain 25mph and 9) Stariha Drive, Ellis Road to Airport Service Road – maintain 25mph. The motion was supported by Council Member Jurkas and carried unanimously by roll call vote.
