Class A type crimes (more serious) were down 13% for the month and up 8% for the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were down by 1% for the month and down by 11% for the fiscal year. Total crimes were down by 8% for the month and down by 1% for the fiscal year.

PATROL DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

Patrol Division responded to the Hoffmaster State Park on a missing woman. Officers arrived and met with the complainant who stated his wife had left walking for four hours and had not returned. The officers along with a tracking dog from the state police assisted in searching the area. The officers also had assistance from the DNR who checked the beach area on their ATV. After a few hours of searching, the officers located the missing woman who got lost while hiking. She was fine and there were no reported problems. The woman was checked out medically and released.

Patrol Division responded to the 2100 block of W. Sherman on gun shots that had been fired and struck a house. The officer made contact with the homeowners who said no one was injured. The victim advised that he and his family were inside the residence at the time the house was struck by bullets. The bullets hit the front door and front of the house. The officers processed the scene, collected the bullets and checked for security cameras. The surrounding area was also searched on foot by the officers but nothing else was located. The bullets that were collected were sent to the Michigan State Crime Lab. The shooting remains open and it is currently being investigated.

Patrol Division responded to the 1700 block of Channel rd on a reported boating accident that had occurred in the Mona Lake channel. Upon arrival, the officers did their best to assist the boaters who were still on the boat. The boat was on the rocks at the end of the break wall and the motor had stalled. The officer grabbed a rope that was attached to the boat to keep the boat from drifting away from the rocks. The driver advised he had severed one of his fingers and was bleeding badly. There were five other occupants on board as well as a dog. Two officers held onto the rope and helped hold the rope to keep the boat close to the rocks. One officer retrieved life vests from shore and tossed them to the occupants of the boat since they did not all have life vests. The boat was constantly crashing on the rocks due to the large waves and was taking on water due to holes in the hull which was causing the boat to sink. The officers contacted the Coast Guard to assist with the rescue. Due to the large waves, they were unable to safely get a tow rope to the front of the boat. NSFD fire personnel were able to get on the rocks up by the front of the boat and began rescuing the occupants one by one. The officers were able to secure the boat to the break wall and helped the last two occupants off of the boat as it became mostly submerged. Three passengers were taken to the hospital to be checked. There were no severe injuries. The boat was towed from the channel the following day.


Patrol Division responded to the 600 block of Pontaluna on a larceny report. Three victims that live on Pontaluna reported that there was a male subject driving a pickup truck that would pull up and take bundles of wood from their property that is there for sale. The suspect would load the bundles of wood and leave without paying for it. The same suspect had stolen wood from three different victims in that same area multiple times stealing about a \$1000 dollars' worth of wood. The officer conducted a lengthy investigation which included setting up video and identifying the suspect. The suspect was later interviewed where he confessed to the crimes. The wood was recovered and given back to the victims. A warrant was requested and is being reviewed by the Muskegon Prosecutor's Office for charges of larceny of property.

Patrol Division responded to the 1200 block of Pontaluna on a victim that had been shot. The officers arrived and found that a female victim had been shot in the leg. The officers rendered medical assistance to the female and secured the scene. Once the victim was transported to the hospital the officers conducted an investigation. The officers interviewed the person who had the gun, the victim and multiple witnesses. The officers also processed the scene and seized the weapon. The victim was treated in the hospital for the wound but was later released. The conclusion of the investigation

from the Muskegon Prosecutor's Office was that the shooting was accidental and there was no intention of firing the gun or hurting anyone.



CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of July 2018, the Department recorded 1,467 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 1,174 calls for service. A total of 774 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Friday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 27 parking tickets and 225 traffic citations in August 2018, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 50.98% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

Twenty five officers including command were sent to training this past month which totaled 132 hours. The training included lecture, demonstration and scenario based. All training required some type of test and a passing score that was needed to obtain their certificate.

Officers attended School Recourse Officer's training that was held in Lansing. This 40 hour class went over how to manage classrooms, doing security checks on schools and putting on presentations.

All officers including command had one hour of training on firearms. Exercises were used to help officers become more accurate on firing their duty weapons and went over the Norton Shores Policy involving the use of weapons.

One officer spent 16 hours in leadership and management class. This was held in Grand Rapids. This class was to help instill leadership qualities and how to handle subordinates.

Officers were sent to 16 hour training on defensive tactic updates. This training was specific to instructors that covered updates on the laws, civil liability and new defensive tactics that are now used.

DETECTIVE BUREAU HIGHLIGHTS

During the month of August the Detective Bureau was assigned fifteen new cases. Five cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a drive by shooting complaint in the 2100 block of West Sherman. Multiple shots were fired and three rounds struck a home in the area. Surveillance video was collected from multiple businesses in the area. Neighbors were interviewed and a few possible suspects have been identified. The investigation is ongoing.

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The Detective Bureau assisted Ottawa County Sherriff Office on a search warrant in the 2000 block of Lawnel. Numerous items of stolen property were recovered and turned over to Ottawa County.

The Detective Bureau assisted in investigating a subject that had stolen over 250 bundles of fire wood in the 600 block of E. Pontaluna. The subject confessed to stealing the wood. The wood was returned to the owners and a warrant has been issued for the offender.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 44 arrest warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 25 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The detective from WEMET conducted a buy bust in the 1100 block of E. Sherman. The detectives seized 27.2 grams of meth.

The detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 100 block of S Wilson St in Wolf Lake. Detectives seized 32 grams of meth, 18 grams of marijuana, a shotgun, and \$641.00 in cash.

The detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 2600 block of 9th St. Detectives seized eight grams of crack cocaine, 20 grams of marijuana, and \$387.00 in cash.

The detective from WEMET assisted in the seizure of over 9.35gm of crack cocaine, 188gm of marijuana, and 100gm of meth during the month of August.
