



Class A type crimes (more serious) were up 35% for the month and up 35% for the fiscal year, but it was the first month of the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were down by 20% for the month and down by 20% for the fiscal year, but it was the first month of the fiscal year. Total crimes were up by 7% for the month and up by 7% for the fiscal year.

PATROL DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

Road Patrol responded to an armed subject in the area of Summit and Austin. The caller reported that his neighbor was walking down the road with a gun in his hand and was intoxicated. Shots were then fired in the area of Columbia and Broadway and it was a male subject firing off a gun. The officers located the suspect and ordered him to put the weapon down. The suspect complied and dropped his weapon on the roadway. The officers took the suspect into custody without any problems. The suspect stated he was walking with the pistol in his hand and decided to fire one round into the ground

while walking down Continental. The suspect was transported and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail for CCW, Reckless discharge of firearm, and possession of a firearm while intoxicated.

Road Patrol responded to the 3900 block of Fink street on a car break in. The officer met with the victim who stated that he received a text this morning from his credit union asking if he made a \$1 purchase with his debit card at Speedway in Norton Shores. The victim went to check for his debit card in his wallet which he left in the center console of his unlocked vehicle overnight. He discovered his wallet was missing from the vehicle and the center console had been rummaged through. Someone had also taken the ignition key from the center console and put it into the ignition and left it in the on position. The victim's roommate thought she heard something around 3am. It was reported there was additional charges made on the debit card all over Muskegon County at which time the officer went to these locations to obtain video and other evidence to be able to identify the suspect. The suspect was identified and eventually located. The suspect was interviewed where he admitted to the officer that he did in fact break into the victim's car and steal items including a debit card where he used it to make purchases. The suspect also admitted to breaking into an additional number of cars in the Norton Shores area including three cars on Rood Rd. and stealing a car out of car lot located on Henry St. The suspect was transported and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail for breaking and entry, illegal use of a debit card and stealing a motor vehicle.


Road Patrol responded to the 1400 block of Capstan for a B&E report. The caller, who is the victim, advised she returned home to find her apartment had been broken into and vandalized. The victim stated she has had no problems with anyone and does not have any suspects in mind. The officer processed the scene by dusting for finger prints, taking photographs and interviewing potential witnesses. The officer observed what appeared to be a full left hand print and a right palm print, showing where the suspect pushed up on the window to open it. The suspect was identified and interviewed. The suspect denied any involvement and said he has never been at the apartment for any reason. The officer dusted the potential prints and was able to lift them; the officer then sent them into the lab where a suspect was identified as the same suspect the officer interviewed. A warrant has been requested for breaking and entry and is being reviewed by the prosecutor's office.

Road Patrol responded to the 700 block of Norton on a weapons offense. It was reported that multiple subjects were driving around and shooting BBs from a BB gun. The victim stated she was walking when she felt that she was hit with what she thought was a pellet or rock. She then witnessed a vehicle with approximately four subjects pointing guns out the window and shooting what appeared to be BBs from a BB gun. There was one person that was injured and other people that were shot at but not hit. Based on the witness statement it appeared the suspects were trying to shoot the BB

gun at a subject riding a bike. A description of the vehicle was given. The officers checked the area including the surrounding streets and put out a broadcast to area agencies but the vehicle or the suspects were never located. Video was collected and the investigation remains open.



During the month of July 2018, the Department recorded 1,503 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 1,232 calls for service. A total of 784 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Monday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 26 parking tickets and 246 traffic citations in July 2018, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 63.7% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

The department had five officers including command spend 60 hours in training that involved firearms, building searches and negotiations.

DETECTIVE BUREAU HIGHLIGHTS

During the month of July the Detective Bureau was assigned nineteen new cases. Twelve cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a burglary that occurred in the 1000 block of E Broadway Ave. Numerous bicycles and two mopeds were stolen along with a computer and four large speakers. Investigator's received a tip giving the location of the stolen property and the identity of a suspect. A search warrant was executed at a residence in the 2600 block of Huizenga. The majority of the property was recovered. Suspects were interviewed and warrants have been issued for two individuals.

The Detective Bureau investigated multiple vehicle larcenies, stolen vehicles, and fraudulent use of credit card complaints. The review of surveillance video from area businesses identified one suspect responsible for all the cases. The subject was identified with the assistance of Roosevelt Park Police Department. Detectives from Norton Shores and Fruitport Township interviewed the suspect. They confessed to the crimes and multiple warrants were issued. The offender is currently in jail and awaiting trial.

The Detective Bureau investigated two child abuse cases. It was determined during the investigations that there was no evidence of abuse and the cases were closed.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 55 arrest warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 25 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

July 25, all members of the Detective Bureau attended the countywide investigator’s meeting.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 1200 block of Flemming, City of Muskegon. The detectives seized 75 grams of meth.

The detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 1800 block of Leahy, City of Muskegon. The detectives seized 6gm of crack cocaine, 3.5gm of cocaine, 60.2 grams of marijuana and 1 gun.

The detective from WEMET assisted in the seizure of over 9.25gm of crack cocaine, 3.5gm of cocaine, 82gm of marijuana, and \$16,183.00 in cash during the month of July.
