

ADMINISTRATION

The purpose of this report is to provide information to the members of the Norton Shores City Council regarding the activities of the Police Department during the month of April 2017.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

Listed below are meetings and activities attended by Chief Gale for the month of April;

On April 5th- Chief Gale attended Coffee with the Police at the New Life Church.

On April 6th- Chief Gale recorded an Arson reward video for the Maranatha Arson case.

On April 8th-Chief Gale volunteered for Habitat for Humanity.

On April 11th- Chief Gale attended the Mental Health Awareness committee meeting in Lansing, where he was sworn in by the Lt. Governor as a committee member.

On April 12th- Chief Gale attended the area C.O.P.S. meeting in which all area Chiefs of Police, Sheriff Poulin and Prosecutor Hilson discussed local issues.

On April 13th- Chief Gale attended the Mental Health Court in Muskegon County and met with Judge Ladas-Hoopes.

Class A type crimes (more serious) were down by 37% for the month and down by 14% for the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were down by 18% for the month and down by 27% for the fiscal year. Total crimes were down by 30% for the month and down by 20% for the fiscal year.

PATROL

Patrol Division responded to the 5200 block of Lake Harbor Rd on a stalking complaint. The complainant has been harassed and stalked by the neighbor on a continuous basis. The officers investigated and then made an arrest. The offender was charged with trespassing and stalking.

Patrol Division responded to multiple suicidal persons complaints. The officers usually arrive to find subject(s) that had attempted to overdose on narcotics or have threatened to hurt themselves. Officers usually talk with the individual(s) and then assist them on transporting the person to the hospital where they can talk to a professional. On one complaint the officers were asked to locate the person who was threatening to hurt himself. With the help of Central Dispatch the officer pinged the person's cell phone and

they located the person at Hoffmaster State Park where they were able to help the individual.


Patrol Division was dispatched to 3900 block of Hess St on the report of an assault. The caller advised he had been assaulted by his roommate and has since been separated from the other person. Officers arrived to investigate. They found that the victim had been assaulted multiple times and it was unsafe to leave the offender in the home. The offender was arrested and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail on the charge of assault.

Patrol Division was dispatched to 2700 block of Leboeuf on a home invasion. The officer was told the suspect had left on foot running wearing a red sweatshirt and black pants and was later identified by the home owner. The officers didn't locate the suspect but investigated the break in by interviewing witnesses and processing the scene. It was determined that nothing was taken but the suspect had entered the home and left when the homeowner yelled at the suspect. The officer was able to identify the suspect and a warrant has been issued for the suspect's arrest for home invasion.

Patrol Division responded to an unwanted subject inside the home in the 3000 block of Valk. The officer met with the home owner who stated he woke up this morning and found an unknown white male sleeping on the couch in the living room. The home owner woke the subject up and told him to get out of his house. The home owner said the subject appeared to be high or intoxicated on something. The subject left walking away from the house. The home owner said the front door must have been left unlocked last night. There were no forced entry signs and there was nothing stolen. No one living in the house knew who the subject was. The officers checked the area and located a subject that matched the description. The officer placed the suspect in custody and the home owner identified the suspect as the one who entered the home. The suspect was transported to the Muskegon County Jail where he was lodged on home invasion.

Total cruiser mileage for the month of April was 30,614 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of April 2017, the Department recorded 1569 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 1,040 calls for service. A total of 672 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Saturday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 7 parking tickets and 176 traffic citations in April, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 55.8% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

Five officers were sent to a 16 hr Precision Driving School on improving the skills of low and high speed maneuvers. Two hours of the class was lecture, 14 hours was practical. Officers are sent twice a year to keep current on their skills and the updated policies and laws around pursuits.

The whole department including command officers went to firearms training. They spent two hours of training that was focused on shooting in low light or no light conditions. The officers trained with a light that attaches to their duty weapon and new holsters.

Two officers were sent to Active Shooter training. These officers can now respond to an active shooting and know how to handle the situation and understand what they have to do once they arrive at the scene. This training helps the officers on how to plan, prepare and stop a subject or subjects that are involved in active shooting. This two day training

will assist our department by making sure all of the officers are trained and up to date on the laws and tactics that involve an active shooting.

One officer was sent to Detroit, MI for 40 hour training in specific computer software. This officer now has the knowledge, skills and is proficient to be a certified operator in Cellebrite software. This training will assist our officer to help in all computer related crimes.

INVESTIGATIONS

During the month of April the Detective Bureau was assigned eight new cases. Three cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a child sexual abuse case where a 12 year old victim disclosed he was assaulted by a longtime family friend. A search warrant was conducted on the suspect's residence and multiple items of evidence were seized and are being processed. The offender was interviewed, and admitted to the assault. The offender was lodged immediately following the interview and is currently in jail awaiting trial.

The Detective Bureau investigated a possible elder abuse case where a 68 year old son received an \$18,000.00 check from his 91 year old mother. After a joint investigation with Adult Protective Services, it was determined the mother gave the money to her son as a gift and was not being taken advantage of.

The Detective Bureau investigated a child abuse case where a joint investigation with Child Protective Services determined the injury to the child's leg was from a fall on a home heater vent and not abuse.

On April 3rd- Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended a Bath Salts and Synthetic Drug Workshop in Lansing put on by Thermo Scientific. The workshop discussed the increase market of Synthetic drugs and the technology of a "hands free" testing system named TruNarc that allows investigators to scan an unknown drug utilizing a laser instead of touching the unknown substance. This system limits the possibility of an investigator becoming injured by the dangerous drug.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 23 arrest warrants and two search warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 20 hours were spent at

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the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 2800 block of Mason. Marijuana, hydrocodone pills and money were all seized. The home owner was arrested for possession with the intent to deliver/manufacture marijuana and synthetic marijuana.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a traffic stop in the area of Peck and Center. Located in the vehicle was 6 grams of heroin, 1.33 grams of marijuana and over \$1,300.00 in cash. The occupant of the vehicle was arrested and charged with possession with the intent to deliver heroin.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in the seizure of over 6 grams of heroin, 235 grams of marijuana, and \$1,844.00 in cash during the month of April.

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC):

The Detective from ICAC conducted a phone examination for Muskegon Heights Police Department for a homicide investigation. Evidence was located and turned over the Muskegon Heights Investigators for further follow up.

The Detective from ICAC assisted in an investigation in Clare County where five devices were examined. Nude images of a minor victim were located on the suspect's cellular phone. Clare County Sheriff Department is seeking charges on the suspect.

The Detective from ICAC attended five days of training in Detroit, MI to become a Cellebrite certified operator and physical analyst. Cellebrite is computer software used to conduct cell phone extractions. The training gives the detective an "expert" title in the use of Cellebrite and can testify in court as such.
