Class A type crimes (more serious) were down by 22% for the month and down by 22% for the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were up by 15% for the month and up by 15% for the fiscal year. Total crimes are up by 7% for the month and down by 7% for the fiscal year.

### PATROL DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

Patrol Division responded to the 2300 block of Castle on a breaking and entering that was in progress. Upon officer's arrival, the officers observed the garage overhead door open and the garage lights on. The pickup truck in the driveway had its windshield completely destroyed as well as the hood. There was a 30 lb. dumbbell on the ground in front of the car with a size consistent with the damage marks. Around back, the boards propped up to keep the dogs on the back porch had been knocked inward onto the porch and a single male sandal was on the steps. Officers also observed the door that leads into the kitchen was kicked in. The officers met with the home owner who stated her ex-boyfriend had broken into her home and was somewhere inside. The victim told

the officers that she was scared and needed help. The officers located the suspect inside the home hiding. The suspect was arrested and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail on the charges of breaking in and entry.

Patrol Division responded to the 1800 block of Channel Rd. on a house fire. The officers met with the home owner who said he was upstairs awake when he smelled what he thought was a candle burning. A smoke alarm then started going off so he got up to see what was going on. The home owner saw that the back of the home was on fire and ran outside. He went to the large garage behind the home where his son was cutting wood and yelled that the house was on fire and they tried to put out the fire with a garden hose. When that did not work they started moving vehicles away from the home once they knew everyone was out. The investigation found that the fire started in the back of the home but at this time it is unknown how it got started. The home was completely destroyed but there were no reported injuries. The fire is still being investigated as a suspicious fire.

Patrol Division responded to the 100 block of Boulder and Farr Rd, 1400 block of Bayview, 800 block of Cedar Woods and 6000 block of Ridgeview on cars that had been broken into. Cash along with electronic equipment were stolen. Officers took reports on multiple cars that had been entered by unknown subject(s) and stealing loose change, purses and electronic equipment from the vehicles. All the vehicles were outside in the driveway, doors left unlocked and entry was made sometime overnight. It was reported that multiple jurisdictions around Muskegon and Ottawa County had cars that were broken into. The investigation is still continuing.


Patrol Division responded to the 3800 block of Taylor St. on a breaking and entering complaint. The victim advised that someone had entered their house while they were on vacation. The victim also noticed that someone had taken the keys to their pickup truck and caused damage to it before returning it. The officers checked the neighborhood and talked with different neighbors who told the officers that they saw the 14 year old resident that is their neighbor who also lives on Taylor, driving the truck. The officers located and talked with the 14 year old suspect who admitted to breaking into the victim's home and taking the keys, BB pistol and Xbox controller and driving the truck and then hitting another car causing damage. The officer arrested and charged the juvenile for breaking and entering and stealing a car.

Patrol Division responded to the area of 2000 Columbus on a report of four subjects breaking into vehicles. The subjects were last seen running east bound on Columbus. Officers arrived and started searching on foot and in the cruiser. After driving around the area for a short time, officers located two subjects dressed in black running in the backyards of Lawnel. The subjects were apprehended and arrested. Both subjects admitted to breaking into cars and stealing items out of them. Some of the items have been recovered. The subjects were charged with larceny and obstruction of police. It is

unknown if these are the same two suspects that broke into the cars that occurred earlier in the month. The investigation continues.

Total cruiser mileage for the month of July was 28,743 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of July 2017, the Department recorded 1,612 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 1,152 calls for service. A total of 782 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Saturday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 29 parking tickets and 240 traffic citations in July, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 59% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

Two officers were sent to RAD (Rape, Aggression, and Defense) training which teaches officers on how to instruct women in realistic self-defense tactics and techniques. Our officers will be able to provide women in our community on how to be more aware of their surroundings and be better prepared to reduce risk by instructing the women students on basic hands on self-defense training.

Five officers including command had over 10 hours of training which included firearms and building searches. These officers are part of the Norton Shores Perimeter Team

which responds to high stress felony situations. They are part of a Muskegon County wide team.

**DETECTIVE BUREAU HIGHLIGHTS**

During the month of July the Detective Bureau was assigned 10 new cases. Two cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

**MAJOR ACTIVITIES**

The Detective Bureau is investigating a Criminal Sexual Conduct (CSC) complaint that occurred in the 6600 block of Grand Haven Rd. A 14 year old female reported being touched by an acquaintance of her parent(s). Interviews have been conducted on the victim and witnesses and the investigation is ongoing.

The Detective Bureau is investigating a suspicious fire that occurred in the 1800 block of Channel Rd, located in the Maranatha Complex. Investigators are working with the Norton Shores Fire Department, Michigan State Police, insurance investigators and the owners of the structure in determining the cause of the fire.

The Detective Bureau assisted the road patrol in the investigation of vehicles being broken into in the Sherman Manor area. Investigators assisted by obtaining and executing a search warrant on the suspect's vehicle. Stolen property was located within the vehicle and attempts are being made in identifying the owners of the property.

On July 12<sup>th</sup> - Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended Lakeshore Human Trafficking Task Force meeting.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 45 arrest warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 28 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

**WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)**

The Detective from WEMET assisted on a search warrant in the Muskegon area where the owner of the home was arrested and charged with possession with the intent to

deliver narcotics after locating 2 grams of meth, 1.4 grams of heroin, 70 hydrocodone pills and \$90.00 in cash.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a package interdiction in the Muskegon area where 77 grams of marijuana and 18 grams of hashish was intercepted. The offender in this case is still under investigation.

The Detective from WEMET assisted on a search warrant in the Muskegon area where a subject was arrested after 55 grams of heroin, 100 grams of crack cocaine, a 9mm pistol, \$6,260.00 and a 2011 truck was seized. The offender is being charged with possession with the intent to deliver narcotics and firearm charges.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in the seizure of over 28 grams of meth, 111 grams of crack cocaine, 64 grams of heroin, one firearm, and \$8,527.00 in cash during the month of July.

#### INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC):

The Detective from ICAC conducted an examination of a laptop computer that was turned over by a resident in the 700 block of E. Hile Rd. The owner of the computer feared there was Child Sexual Abusive Material (CSAM) on the computer placed on there by their estranged husband. The computer was examined and no CSAM was located.

The Detective from ICAC assisted in cellular phone examinations and extractions from the search warrant executed by Norton Shores Detectives on the vehicle's broken into in the Sherman Manor area. The examinations produced two other possible suspects in the vehicle larcenies that investigators are currently attempting to locate.
