

ADMINISTRATION

The purpose of this report is to provide information to the members of the Norton Shores City Council regarding the activities of the Police Department during the month of March 2018.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

On March 5, Chief Gale met with the City Administration regarding the Capital Improvement budget.

On March 7, Chief Gale met with Ottawa County Sheriff Kempker regarding Mental Health training.

On March 8, Chief Gale met with the Intermediate School District Superintendent Dr. Severson regarding a Safe School Initiative.

On March 12-15, Chief Gale worked with the Motorola body/car camera team to program and install the camera program.

On March 20-22, Chief Gale assisted with body cam/radio and car camera training for all officers.

Class A type crimes (more serious) were up by 58% for the month and down by 2% for the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were down by 12% for the month and up by 6% for the fiscal year. Total crimes are up by 25% for the month and up by 1% for the fiscal year.

PATROL DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

Road Patrol responded to the 1100 E Bryon on a break in complaint. The officer arrived and met the home owner. The home owner advised that sometime after 2:00 a.m. his garage/barn was broken into. The officer inspected the door that was entered and damaged. The door appeared to have been forced open, and the door casing was damaged. The officer processed the scene by photographing the damage and fingerprinting the door knob, door frame, and windows. The home owner reported that both hand tools and electric tools were stolen. The officers checked the surrounding area for any further evidence. The case remains active.

Road Patrol responded to the 2600 block of Delray Drive on a larceny report. The officer met with the victim who stated she was selling a video game and had put it for sale on

Craigslist. The suspect called and stated he was interested and wanted to buy it. The suspect arrived at the victim's residence and the victim handed the gaming system to the suspect. The suspect told the victim he was going to put the gaming system in his car and get the money. The suspect then got into a blue car and left the area without paying the victim. The victim only knew the suspect's first name. The gaming system was worth about \$240. The case remains open and is being investigated.


Road Patrol responded to the 500 block of Lakeshore Blvd. on multiple car break-ins. The officer took 6 car larceny complaints that had occurred in the night. All the complaints were the same, the cars were left unlocked in the driveway. No damage to the vehicles and only a small amount of money was taken from the vehicles. The officers are still investigating the case.

Road Patrol responded to over 17 complaints involving mentally ill individuals with having suicidal thoughts or elderly people with Alzheimer's/Dementia type diseases. Most of these calls involved the officer assisting the person that needed help by talking, counseling, or getting them home safe. The officer(s) also have to make an assessment on the individual to determine if they need to be transported to the Community Mental Health for immediate counseling. Our officers average 15 calls per month that involve mental health situations.

Road Patrol responded to a business in the 5400 block of Harvey Street on a stolen vehicle report. The officer met with the manager of the store who stated a customer rented a 2018 Chevy Silverado truck and has failed to return the vehicle when it was due. The vehicle was rented on March 8, 2018 and was to be returned within 24 hours. The vehicle was not returned. The business manager contacted the suspect and the suspect stated that he was on his way to bring it back but again never showed up with the vehicle. The manager waited three days before filing a report. The officer was able to track the truck on GPS. The GPS showed the truck at a business in Canton, MI. With the help and assistance from the Canton Police Department the vehicle was located and impounded which eventually was returned to the business. The suspect was arrested and charged with theft of a vehicle and lodged in the Muskegon County Jail.


Total cruiser mileage for the month of March is 23,542.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of March 2018, the Department recorded 1,950 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 986 calls for service. A total of 679 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Friday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 5 parking tickets and 301 traffic citations in March, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 63.4% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

Three officers went to a Tactical Leadership training held in Allendale. The focus was on the goals and objectives for an Emergency Response Team and the type of training they should be doing.

Twelve command officers and seventeen officers were trained on the use of body cams and the new hand held radios that the Norton Shores Police Department will now be using. This was a four hour training which was put on by Motorola. This training is for the new equipment that the officers will be required to use while in uniform. The Norton Shores policy was also explained to everyone.

Seven officers went to a Legal Update training held at the Ottawa County Sheriff's Department. This was an eight hour training to update and inform officers of the new and updated laws that went into effect January 1, 2018.

DETECTIVE BUREAU HIGHLIGHTS

During the month of March the Detective Bureau was assigned twenty new cases. Nine cases were cleared by arrest, warrants, or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a credit card fraud where an ex-girlfriend purchased item from Amazon without the owner's permission. Warrant has been issued.

The Detective Bureau had a week long jury trial for an in-depth armed robbery investigation that occurred in 2016. The subject was found guilty on all charges and is awaiting sentencing.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 43 arrest warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 25 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

Detective Morningstar has been teaching RAD Women's Self Defense Class during the month of March.

Detective Morningstar attended Mental Health training.

March 1, Detective Swanker attended the county child death review meeting.

March 20, Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended tactical leadership training.

March 26, Detective Pieske, Detective Swanker, and Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended legal update training.

March 28, all members of the Detective Bureau attended the county investigators meeting.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The Detective from WEMET assisted in two search warrants in the Muskegon Heights area where three guns and a 1/3 kilo of cocaine were seized. Two subjects were arrested.

The Detective from WEMET assisted with a search warrant in the area of Norton Avenue and Mona Street in Muskegon Heights. Weapons and pills were seized.

SPECIAL SERVICES DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

Lt. Poel worked on the camera and radio installation and training for the first part of March.

Lt. Poel prepared for the CALEA audit conducted at the end of March. The audit checked 25% of the files and all were found to be in compliance by the CALEA assessor.

Lt. Poel attended the Unity Tour Fundraiser to help raise money for the Unity Tour to honor Ofc. Ginka in Washington DC.
