CITY COUNCIL MEETING
January 18, 2022

A regular meeting of the Norton Shores City Council was held on Tuesday, January 18, 2022 at 5:30 p.m. at the Norton Shores Branch Library Community Room, 705 Seminole Road. Pastor Doug Vandermolen delivered an invocation.

22-006 Minutes

Council Member Morgenstern moved to approve the minutes of the January 4 council meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Flanders and carried unanimously.

22-007 Consent

Council Member Jurkas moved to approve the Consent Agenda which consisted of: a) Department Reports for Police, Fire, Public Works, Administrative Services, Library and the Quarterly Financial Report. The motion was supported by Council Member Moulatsiotis and carried unanimously.

22-008 Sole Source Purchase – 4049 Nob Hill Lift Station Pumps, Kennedy Industries

Council Member Moulatsiotis moved to approve the sole source purchase and installation of two Flygt pumps at the 4049 Nob Hill Drive lift station from Kennedy Industries, of Wixom, MI, at an estimated cost of \$26,445. The motion was supported by Council Member Olson and carried unanimously.

22-009 Traffic Control Order – No Parking Signs, Dune Harbor Park

Council Member Moulatsiotis moved to approve the installation of No Parking signs along both sides of Winnetaska Road, between Lincoln Street and West cul-de-sac, the west side of Lincoln Street, between Lincoln Park Drive and Leon Street, Seminole Road, between Norton Hills Road and 2280 Seminole Road. The motion was supported by Council Member Kasher and carried unanimously.

22-010 Special Use Permit – 3530 Henry Street, Muskegon Associates, LLC

Council Member Flanders moved to approve a special use permit application to Muskegon Associates, LLC for drive-thru usage and other site improvements at 3530 Henry Street. The motion was supported by Council Member Morgenstern. Civil Engineer Mike Miller of Paradigm Engineers and Constructors and City Planner Ted Woodcock addressed concerns Council members had related to the application.


