22-061 Minutes

Council Member Olson moved to approve the proposed FY2023 Budget as presented. The motion was supported by Council Member Moulatsiotis and carried unanimously.


22-064 Adopt Zoning Ordinance Amendment – Chap. 48, Sec. 335-336, Farm and Agriculture

Council Member Moulatsiotis moved to approve a Zoning Ordinance Amendment to Chapter 48, Sec. 335-336, to add the term Farm and clarify the definition of Agriculture. The motion was supported by Council Member Olson and carried unanimously by roll call vote.
