RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the West Michigan Shoreline Regional Development Commission (WMSRDC) is soliciting applications for the 2026-2029 WestPlan Transportation Improvement (TIP) Grant, making funding available for local jurisdictions for road work improvement projects; and

WHEREEAS, the City desires to secure a WestPlan Transportation Improvement (TIP) Grant to help fund the proposed road work projects; and

WHEREAS, the City is seeking to submit for consideration for the 2026-2029 WestPlan Transportation Improvement (TIP) Grant program the following five projects: Henry Street, Porter Road to Pontaluna Road, McCracken Street, Sherman Blvd. to Bonneville Drive, Randall Road, Vineyard Lane to Martin Road, Randall Road, Henry Street to Vineyard Lane and Airline Road, Shettler Road to Black Lake Bridge; and

WHEREAS, the City will provide the necessary match for its projects selected to be part of the Transportation Improvement (TIP) Grant and approved for design and construction by the City Council; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Norton Shores City Council authorizes the Department of Public Works to submit five grant applications requesting funds up to \$4,081,600 through the West Michigan Shoreline Regional Development Commission (WMSRDC) 2026-2029 WestPlan Transportation Improvement (TIP) Grant.
