NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Norton Shores City Council hereby endorses the Senior Millage Plan concept, and supports the use of \$115,402 in Senior Millage funding to the Safe Seniors Detective position.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council in the exercise of its discretion, reviewed the particular facts and circumstances of each proposal in terms of all of the following standards and each shall find adequate evidence showing that each must be satisfied:

1. The proposed use will be harmonious with the existing or intended character of the general vicinity and in accordance with the general objectives of the master plan and zoning ordinances of current adoption because it will fit in with the current Master Plan;
2. The proposed use will be served adequately by existing essential public services and facilities, such as highways, streets, police and fire protection, drainage structures, refuse disposal and schools, or the applicant will provide for those services and facilities because the services are existing;
3. The proposed use or structures will not cause an overcrowding of land or undue concentration of population because the use is not residential in nature;
4. The proposed use is consistent with the public health, safety, and welfare of the City of Norton Shores because the proposed use is congruent with the City's Master Plan and
5. The proposed use constitutes a socially and economically desirable use of the land when considering those who will use the land, residents and property owners of the immediately adjacent properties, as well as the community as a whole because the proposed use will have a minimal impact on the surrounding area.
