24-018 Minutes

Council Member Jurkas moved to approve minutes from the February 20 city council meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Kasher and carried unanimously.

Council Member Fisher moved to approve minutes from the February 26 work session meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Fisher and carried unanimously.

24-019 Consent

Council Member Fisher moved to approve the Consent Agenda which consisted of: a) Traffic Signal Maintenance Agreement – Muskegon County Road Commission. The motion was supported by Council Member Jurkas and carried unanimously.

24-020 Water & Sewer Rate Study

Council Member Fisher moved to authorize a professional service agreement with Municipal Analytics of Ann Arbor, Michigan, for the Water & Sewer Rate Study in the amount of \$28,500. The motion was supported by Council Member Kasher. Council Member Jurkas moved to amend the motion to include a council member on a panel when reviewing the rate study. The motion was supported by Council Member Hylland. Council Member Olson moved to amend the motion to include a resident of Norton Shores to be included on the panel as well. The motion was supported by Council Member Jurkas and failed 4/3 by a roll call vote with Council Members Fisher, Hylland, Olson, and Mayor Nelund against.
