24-057 Minutes

Council Member Jurkas moved to approve minutes from the May 21 City Council meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Sowa and carried unanimously.

24-058 Council Member Olson moved to approve minutes from the May 28 work session meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Sowa and carried unanimously.

24-059 Consent

Council Member Fisher moved to approve the Consent Agenda which consisted of: a) Bid Authorization – Hot-in-Place/Milling and Resurfacing. The motion was supported by Council Member Sowa and carried unanimously.

24-060 Certify Delinquent Bills to the Tax Rolls

Council Member Jurkas moved to approve the certifications of delinquent water and sewer bills, special assessments, revenue bond installments, and property transfer affidavits as presented to the City Assessor and the City Treasurer, for imposing the charges on the 2024 general property tax roll in the aggregate total of \$45,681.08. The motion was supported by Council Member Kasher and carried unanimously.

24-061 Authorize – Summer Tax Collection Agreement – Mona Shores Public Schools

Council Member Jurkas moved to authorize the Mayor to execute an agreement with Mona Shores Public Schools for summer tax collection for a fee of \$3.00 per parcel expiring June 30, 2025. The motion was supported by Council Member Khatir and carried unanimously.

General Public Comment

Council Member Olson asked if we were able to able to repair any of the wood barriers on the Lake Harbor Road curve. Public Works Director Jim Murphy said the city can ask Spicer Group for the cost to repair sections.

Council Member Fisher stated she had a resident call recently about a vehicle with a person living with it. Lieutenant Joel Hoeksema stated the Police department is aware and working with the owner of the vehicle.

Mayor Pro tem Hylland mentioned a recent suggestion from a resident for a crosswalk between Ross Park Elementary school and Ross Park.

City Administrator Anthony Chandler shared the pickleball courts should be open by the end of the week. Council Member Jurkas asked if the courts will be first come first serve, and Mr. Chandler confirmed.
