A regular meeting of the Norton Shores City Council was held remotely via video conferencing on Tuesday, June 2, 2020 at 5:30 p.m.

Minutes

20-081 Council Member Beecham moved to approve the minutes of the May 19, 2020 city council meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member ~~Beecham~~ and carried unanimously by roll call vote. Jurkas

20-082 Council Member Flanders moved to approve the minutes of the May 26, 2020 city council work session. The motion was supported by Council Member Olson and carried unanimously by roll call vote.

20-083 Consent

Council Member Beecham moved to approve the Consent Agenda consisting of: a) Request Bids-City Hall, Fire Station 2 and Library Roof Replacement and b) Approve Update-COVID-19 Mitigation Measures. The motion was supported by Council Member Morgenstern and carried unanimously by roll call vote.

20-084 Appoint Public Works Director

Mayor Nelund announced the appointment of James R. Murphy, PE to the position of Public Works Director.

20-085 Buy/Sell Agreement – 5688 Grand Haven Road

Council Member Jurkas moved to approve a buy/sell agreement to purchase property at 5688 Grand Haven Road for a total purchase price of \$37,400 and authorize the Mayor and City Clerk to execute documents related to the purchase. The motion was supported by Council Member Beecham and carried unanimously by roll call vote.

20-086 Certify Delinquent Bills – 2020 Tax Roll

Council Member Beecham moved to approve certifications of delinquent water and sewer bills, special assessments, revenue bond installments, and property transfer

affidavits to the City Assessor and City Treasurer for imposing the charges on the 2020 general property tax roll in the aggregate total of \$78,275.94. The motion was supported by Council Member Sladick and carried unanimously by roll call vote.


General Public Comment
