Subject: Street Lighting LED Replacement

The Honorable Mayor
and
Members of the City Council

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Consumers Energy has been replacing failed streetlights with LED fixtures. The LED fixtures are more energy efficient and longer lasting than the High Pressure Sodium (HPS) fixtures they are replacing; therefore, the operation and maintenance charge for the LED fixtures is approximately \$6.00 per month less than the HPS fixtures.

To maintain accurate maintenance and billing records, Consumers is requesting that the City amend the standard lighting contract to authorize a designee to respond to periodic reconciliation notices. Otherwise, City Council would be required to act on such notices.

Adoption of the attached resolution will authorize the Public Works Director to sign the amended Standard Lighting Contracts with Consumers Energy as periodic reconciliation notices arise.
