Ladies and Gentlemen:

A section of the sanitary sewer main along the Lake Michigan shoreline on Maranatha Bible and Missionary Conference property was relocated as an emergency measure due to severe beach erosion. The final costs of the emergency relocation have been received and verified.

The relocation costs incurred by the contractor, Jackson Merkey Contractors Inc., totaled \$40,118.75. Funds are available in the Sewer Fund for this work.

Adoption of the attached resolution will authorize payment in the amount of \$40,118.75 to Jackson Merkey Contractors Inc., of Muskegon, MI, and amend the FY-2020 budget from the Sewer Fund accordingly for the emergency replacement of the section of sanitary sewer within an easement on the Maranatha property.
