**ADMINISTRATION**

Class A type crimes (more serious) were up by 10% for the month and down by 12% for the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were down by 14% for the month and up by 11% for the fiscal year. Total crimes are up by 2% for the month and down by 4% for the fiscal year.

PATROL DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

Patrol Division responded to the 6400 block of Norton Center Drive on a breaking and entering report. The victim stated he arrived at work and found that the building had been broken into and numerous tools had been stolen. The victim stated that he stores heavy duty equipment such as saws, heavy duty heater and cable in his building for his construction company. The officer processed the crime scene and developed a suspect. The investigation remains open.

Patrol Division responded to the 900 block of Sterling Court on a identify theft complaint. The ID theft crime originated from the Equifax Credit Bureau data breach earlier this summer. The victim stated she looked up her information and found she was a victim of the data breach. Since then, the victim has had credit card issues and discovered her identity was stolen. The victim recently found someone filed an

unemployment claim through her employer, tried to take out multiple loans and open up credit cards in her name. Since that time the victim has had to cancel all credit cards and close her bank accounts. There are no suspects in the case and it has been filed with the FBI.

Patrol Division responded to multiple car break-ins that occurred during the early morning hours. Officers took over a dozen complaints in the neighborhoods of Boulder Drive, Harbor Point Court, Ridgeway Drive and Nob Hill Drive of cars that were broken into and items stolen. Items stolen included money, electronics, cell phones, computers and sunglasses. All the vehicles were entered on the same night, and all were unlocked and parked in a driveway. Officers were able to obtain evidence at one of the crime scenes along with home surveillance video which helped them develop a suspect. The suspect was apprehended and interviewed. The suspect confessed to the crimes and most of the stolen items were located. The suspect was arrested and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail for multiple counts of larceny of a vehicle.


Patrol Division responded to a local business at the 5600 block of Harvey Street on a robbery that had just occurred. The employee stated she had been watching the suspect steal multiple clothing items. As he was leaving without paying, the employee confronted the suspect and asked him to come to the office. The suspect complied and the employee escorted the suspect to the loss prevention office. While the officers were responding to the location, Dispatch advised that a male suspect had assaulted an employee and was last seen running towards Menards wearing a gray sweatshirt and sweatpants and white ear buds. The suspect was arrested and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail on the charge of robbery.

Patrol Division responded to over 185 accidents and general assists that involved cars that slid off the roadway or had broken down causing a traffic hazard. Most of the accidents were weather related and had occurred on the highways.

Patrol Division responded to over 60 alarms to different businesses and residential homes throughout the city. All of these alarms were found to be false. The business and homes were checked and found to be secure. Some of the false trips were due to weather and snow plow trucks rattling the doors while plowing the parking lots.

Total cruiser mileage for the month of December was 20,077 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of December 2017, the Department recorded 1,642 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 1179 calls for service. A total of 769 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Saturday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 3 parking tickets and 169 traffic citations in December, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 49% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

The Norton Shores Police Department spent over 96 hours in training. This includes all patrol and command officers.

Eighteen officers including twelve command officers attended our annual AED/CPR training that is required. All officers trained for two hours that involved a lecture, demonstration and hands on practical test.

Two officers had 16 hours of radar training that will certify them to use radar in their patrol cars. The radar will assist the officers to detect speeding and help with traffic and traffic related complaints.

Two command officers had 10 hours of leadership class that is held in Grand Rapids. This is a series of classes that are held once a month for six months.

**DETECTIVE BUREAU HIGHLIGHTS**

During the month of December the Detective Bureau was assigned 17 new cases. Nine cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

**MAJOR ACTIVITIES**

The Detective Bureau investigated a Criminal Sexual Conduct complaint where an adult offender sexually assaulted a juvenile. The juvenile disclosed three separate sexual acts during their forensic interview. The suspect was interviewed by investigators and a confession was obtained. The case is currently at the prosecutor's office for review.

The Detective Bureau investigated a death in the 300 block of Churchill Drive. The death was ruled a suicide by the medical examiner's office and the case is closed.

The Detective Bureau assisted the road patrol division in a series of vehicle break-ins that occurred on the west side of the city. Detectives assisted in the development of a suspect and executed a parole search at the suspect's residence.

The Detective Bureau is investigating five additional Criminal Sexual Conduct complaints. All of the complaints are in various stages of the investigation.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 55 arrest warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 30 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

On December 3<sup>rd</sup>, Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended the annual MI-COPS Christmas Memorial for fallen officers and their families.

On December 6<sup>th</sup>, Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended the case review at the Muskegon County Child Abuse Council.

On December 20<sup>th</sup>, Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended monthly Emergency Response Team training that was held at NSPD.

**WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)**

The Detective from WEMET assisted with a search warrant in 1000 block of E. Broadway Avenue. Evidence collected was 7.6 grams of cocaine, and 11.4 grams of marijuana. The resident of the home was lodged on possession of narcotic charges.

The Detective from WEMET assisted with a search warrant and a traffic stop in the 200 block of Huston Avenue in Muskegon. In total, 109.7 grams of cocaine, 4.3 grams of crack cocaine, 1.9 grams of marijuana and \$1,025 in cash was seized. An arrest warrant was issued for the offender.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a traffic stop in the area of Sanford Street and Hume Avenue in Muskegon Heights. Three subjects were taken into custody after a foot chase. 11.84 grams of crack cocaine, 11.08 grams of heroin, and a handgun were seized. Two of the three subjects were lodged on possession charges.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in the seizure of over 26 grams of crack cocaine, 235 grams of cocaine, 12 grams of heroin, 32 grams of marijuana, two firearms and \$5,749.00 in cash during the month of December.
