Class A type crimes (more serious) were down by 10% for the month and up 1% for the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were down by 5% for the month and up by 1% for the fiscal year. Total crimes are down by 8% for the month and up by 1% for the fiscal year.

PATROL DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

Patrol Division responded to the 3000 block of Henry on a stolen car report. The vehicle had been rented out and has not been returned for over the past six months. The victim attempted to contact the person that had taken the car but was unable to locate them. The officer took the report and entered the vehicle into the system as stolen. The officer investigated the complaint and located the vehicle. The vehicle was impounded and given back to the owner. The officer continued the investigation where he was able to obtain an arrest warrant on the offender. The offender was arrested and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail.

Patrol Division responded the 1800 block of Manor on a house that had been broken into. The victim reported that she worked all day, and during that time, a male subject with short black hair that was riding a bike entered the open garage to her residence and stole four bags of cans/bottles. The victim valued these bags at \$20.00 a piece for a

total value being \$80.00. The victim believed she knows who the male is, and mentioned he usually rides his bike in the area, but does not know the male's name. The victim explained that her neighbor had advised her that this male suspect had taken the bottles/ cans. The officer spoke with neighbor who advised that the offender had come to his house prior to going to the victim's house (around the time of 1:30PM - 2:30PM), asking about work. The witness advised he turned the offender away, and then further advised he observed the offender walk toward the victim's garage until the offender was out of view. The neighbor advised that when the offender walked back down the driveway, he was carrying two bags of bottles/ cans which he did not have with him before. The officer investigated the complaint and was able to identify the male suspect. The suspect was located and he admitted to stealing the cans. The officer arrested the suspect and lodged him at the Muskegon County Jail.

Patrol Division was dispatched to the 2900 block of Leon on a home that had been broken into. The officer arrived and spoke with the home owner who advised her house had been unlocked last night. When the home owner woke up this morning she found her pink purse missing from the chair near the front door. She had been sleeping at the time in the living room. Also taken from the living room area was her daughter's purse containing toys, and two trac cell phones. Officers investigated the complaint and were able to identify a suspect. The suspect was located and interviewed. During the interview the suspect admitted to the crime and gave back some of the property. The suspect was arrested and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail.


Patrol Division was dispatched to a business on Henry St in reference to an assault that had taken place. The officer arrived and met with the victim who stated that she was in the aisle of the store when she was approached by an unknown male. The male suspect walked at her quickly asking if she remembered or recognized him. The man then reached for the victim's hand and pulled it into his genital area. The victim said that she first thought that the contact was accidental but the man then pulled her hand in two or three more times. The man then walked away. The officer reviewed the video and searched the area for the male suspect but was not located at that time. The officer investigated the complaint and was able to identify the suspect. The male suspect was later located and transported to the Norton Shores Police Department where he was interviewed. The male suspect admitted to grabbing the woman's hand and pulling it towards him and forcing her to touch him. The male suspect was arrested and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail.

Road Patrol was dispatched to the 1400 block of Farr Rd. in reference to a business that had been broken into. The officer arrived and met with the manager who stated he had

gotten to work and found the office in disarray. The owner said he arrived at the office and used the door at the south east part of the building when he walked inside he observed drawers to cabinets open and several pairs of glasses on the ground. He then backed out of the building and notified dispatch. The building was checked and the officers did not locate anyone inside. The officers and the owner did a walk through and he pointed out that three iPads were missing, a laptop, and approximately \$100.00 in cash. It was determined that entry was made from the roof top and over \$4,000 worth items were either stolen or destroyed. There was a lot of damage inside the building. The officer conducted an investigation and was able to identify four subjects. All four subjects were under the age of 17. The subjects were located and interviewed. All four subjects admitted to breaking into the business and stealing the items. The four juvenile subjects were charged with the crime of breaking in and entering. They are waiting to go to court.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of June 2018, the Department recorded 1,471 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 1,148 calls for service. A total of 765 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Saturday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 38 parking tickets and 244 traffic citations in June 2018, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 63.6% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

During the month of June the Norton Shores Officers spent over 200 hours in training. This includes the Administration, Sergeants, and Corporals.

One command officer had 80 hours of schooling at the Michigan State University Staff and Command. This involved both on line and on campus lectures. The command officer finished up eight months of schooling which focused on management and administrative work. The Sergeant graduated this past month.

One command officer spent 40 hours in firearms training to become a firearms instructor. He was taught how to help and assist officers in the use of their duty weapons and the laws that cover when to use deadly force. He is one of four firearms instructors for the department.

One officer was sent to an interview and interrogation class. This class was held in Grand Rapids and was a 40 hour training course. This training focused on how to interview witnesses, suspects and look for key signs of deception and how to obtain truthful statements. This training also helped the officer with understanding communication barriers and how to read nonverbal cues.

27 officers including command were trained by Health West in the different types of mental health issues and how to handle the people that are involved. Health West gave ideas and advised what programs are out there to assist the officers involving the mentally ill. There were four different segments of the training each for two hours.

DETECTIVE BUREAU HIGHLIGHTS

During the month of June the Detective Bureau was assigned twenty-one new cases. Thirteen cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a home invasion in the 2900 block of Leon St. The home owner's purse and cell phone were taken during the crime. The victim located images of a possible suspect from a shared device. The suspect was located by Roosevelt Police Department a week later. The suspect admitted to being in the home and taking the items. The suspect is currently in jail and awaiting trial.

The Detective Bureau investigated a criminal sexual conduct case that occurred in the 700 block of W. Norton. An intoxicated male inappropriately touched a female while both were shopping at a retail store. Detectives tracked down surveillance video from multiple locations in the area of the incident and obtained an identification of the suspect. The suspect was located after returning to the retail store where the incident occurred wearing the same clothing worn on the day of the crime. The suspect admitted to the crime. The suspect is currently in jail and awaiting trial.

The Detective Bureau investigated a witness intimidation case. A suspect in a criminal sexual conduct case contacted relatives of the victim and made threats. The suspect was interviewed and turned themselves in after a warrant was issued.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 42 arrest warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 25 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

June 27, all members of the Detective Bureau attended the countywide investigator's meeting.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 1200 block of Ducey Ave., city of Muskegon. The detectives seized 10.19gm of marijuana, 1.18gm of crack cocaine, .3gm of heroin, a handgun, and \$1,230.00 in cash.

The detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 2600 block of Reynolds St., city of Muskegon Heights. The detectives seized 3.8gm of cocaine, 5.8gm of crack cocaine, 3 handguns, and \$983.00 in cash.

The detective from WEMET assisted in the seizure of over 15.06gm of crack cocaine, 272gm of cocaine, 11gm of marijuana, and \$2,852.00 in cash during the month of June.
