ADMINISTRATION

Class A type crimes (more serious) were down by 9% for the month and down by 14% for the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were up by 11% for the month and down by 25% for the fiscal year. Total crimes are down by 1% for the month and down by 18% for the fiscal year.

PATROL DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

The Patrol Division responded to a structure fire in the 800 block of Wilson Ave. A neighbor reported that the backyard of a home on Wilson was on fire and it appeared to have spread to the back of the home. Upon our arrival the fire department was already on scene. The backyard was on fire including the wooden privacy fence surrounding it and part of the garage. The fire was put out but it was determined that it was the cause of arson. A suspect has been developed and the investigation continues.

The Patrol Division was dispatched to the 500 block of Aue Rd. on an unknown male subject that was inside the victim's unlocked car. The victim yelled at the suspect and he left west bound on Aue riding a bicycle. Officers located the suspect at the corner of

Aue and Henry. The suspect was arrested. Upon further investigation the officers found that the suspected was in possession of a stolen bike. The bike was stolen from a house located in the 600 block of Ross Rd. The stolen items were located and returned to the owners. The suspect was arrested and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail.

The Patrol Division was dispatched to a business located in the 3100 block of S Getty regarding a breaking and entering. Upon arrival the officer met with the owner who advised that sometime over night that his building had been broken into. Items stolen included cash, perishable items and tools. The officers processed the scene by taking photographs, fingerprinting the area and collecting evidence that was left behind. There are no suspects and the investigation continues.


The Patrol Division was dispatched to the 4500 block of Marshall on a break and entering into a garage. The officers arrived and met with the home owner who stated he woke up this morning and saw that his overhead garage door was open. The victim saw that his pickup truck was gone out of the garage. The victim put the truck in the garage last night and closed the garage door at 7:00 PM. The keys were left in the ignition. The truck was a gray 2000 Chevrolet Silverado. Nothing else was stolen or damaged. The truck was located on Black Creek where a suspect who was driving it was taken into custody. The truck was returned to the owner and charges are pending based on the review from the prosecutor.

The Patrol Division responded to the 1000 block of E Broadway on a chemical spill that occurred at a business. The officers assisted the Norton Shores Fire Department and HAZMAT in an acid spill that severely injured two people. The officers investigated the spill at the scene and contacted to the Detective Bureau to follow up on the call.

The Patrol Division responded to over 70 civil domestic complaints. These types of complaints usually involve arguments between neighbors over property boundaries or family members that can't get along but no assault had taken place. Other civil type complaints that the officers responded to are disagreements in child visitation rights, or customers that feel the businesses owe them money back. On average officers respond to more than two civil complaints per shift. These types of complaints take large portion of the officer's time.

Total cruiser mileage for the month of May was 22,852 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of May 2017, the Department recorded 1284 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 1069 calls for service. A total of 627 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Wednesday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 10 parking tickets and 191 traffic citations in May, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 52.3% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

Two command officers attended a training course on how to conduct Internal Investigation in Traverse City. They went through a 16 hour course that taught them about labor rights, contracts and why internal investigations are needed for the organization.

Two command officers assisted by instructing defensive driving for teens at Michigan's Adventure parking lot. The officers trained new teen drivers about how to become better drivers in adverse situations. The officers spent 16 hours training over 30 student drivers. This program is to assist in helping curve accidents for the future drivers.

The whole department attended two different trainings for over 4 hours in regards to the death of Officer Jonathan Ginka. The Emergency Response Debriefing Team from the Michigan State Police put on the training was held at the Norton Shores Police Department. This training helped and assisted in dealing with the grief the officers.

DETECTIVE BUREAU HIGHLIGHTS

During the month of May the Detective Bureau was assigned twenty new cases. Ten cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a threat over Facebook Messenger received by a Mona Shores high school student telling them to not attend school the next day because the school was going to be shot up. The offender was located after obtaining an emergency search warrant from Facebook to identify the user. The subject was taken into custody, admitted to sending the Facebook Messenger message and lodged. The subject was charged with attempted false report of terrorism.

The Detective Bureau investigated four breaking and entering complaints in the area of Getty between Norton and Summit. A suspect was identified a few days later after road patrol officer located him looking in windows of vehicles at Preferred Chrysler. The subject was interviewed by detectives and admitted involvement in all for crimes. Warrant request are pending.

The Detective Bureau assisted the Norton Shores Fire Department and HAZMAT in an acid spill in the 1000 block of East Broadway. The investigation concluded the incident was an accident and both parties involved are still in the hospital being treated for serious chemical burns.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 28 arrest warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 20 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

On May 8th - Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended Internal Affairs training at Ingham County Sheriff's Office. The training was presented by Training Force USA.

On May 24th -all members of the Detective Bureau attended a meeting with the Child Advocacy Center of Muskegon County and other Muskegon County Police Agencies to discuss the proper protocol(s), communication, training, and department consistency in investigations.

On May 31st -Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended the Muskegon County Suicide Fatality Review Team quarterly meeting where 11 suicide cases were reviewed and data collected.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 200 block of Forrest Ave. and illegal pills, crack cocaine, heroin and money were all seized. The home owner was arrested for possession with the intent to deliver/manufacture narcotics.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a package interdiction in the 1000 block of Evanston. 4 lbs. of partially processed and 1600 grams of usable marijuana were seized. 67 marijuana plants were also confiscated.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in the investigation of a methamphetamine laboratory in the 2000 block of North Sheridan. One subject was arrested for manufacturing methamphetamine.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in the seizure of over 50 grams of heroin, 8 pounds of marijuana, 53 grams of crack cocaine, two handguns, and \$11,533.00 in cash during the month of May.

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC):

The Detective from ICAC conducted two phone examinations and a laptop extraction for Muskegon Police Department reference an infant death at an overnight daycare.

The Detective from ICAC assisted in an investigation in Kent County where a thirteen year old had been picked-up by a fifty-two year old male and was a victim of criminal sexual conduct. When the offender attempted to arrange another meet with the teenager, investigators stepped in and arrested the subject.
