

Class A type crimes (more serious) were up by 19% for the month and up 2% for the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were up 8% for the month and up by 4% for the fiscal year. Total crimes are up 15% for the month and up by 2.5% for the fiscal year.

PATROL DIVISION HIGHLIGHTS

Patrol Division responded to the 6000 Harborside on an active fight between two subjects. The suspect was reported to have a weapon. Officers arrived and found the suspect had fled the area and the victim had been injured from the assault by the suspect. The victim told the officers that she and the suspect had gotten into an argument and the suspect attacked her holding a screw driver. The suspect was located and taken into custody.

Patrol Division responded to 2600 block of LeBoeuf on a burglary in progress. The officers arrived and met with the home owner who stated she had seen someone inside her home. The officers checked the home and found that the back door was forced open and the family dog was locked in the closet. Items that were stolen included credit


cards, electronics and personal items. The crime scene was processed and pictures were taken. A suspect has been developed and the investigation still remains active.

Patrol Division responded to a total of fifteen car break-ins that occurred on Green, Lakeshore, Lakeview, Mona Kai and the surrounding area. This took place over a span of five days in the overnight hours. All of the cars that had been entered were left unlocked or windows rolled down. There was no reported damage to the vehicles. Items that were stolen was loose change and dollar bills. Subjects on bikes were seen earlier in the evening but it is unknown if they had anything to do with the crime. Citizens have been warned to lock their car and not to keep anything of value in the cars. Officers have been directed to patrol these areas.

On May 2, 2018 the case of the abduction and murder involving the victim Jessica Heeringa went to trial. The offender in the case was Jeffery Willis from Fruitport. Jessica Heeringa was abducted from the Exxon Gas Station located at 1196 E Sternberg Rd in the City of Norton Shores on April 26, 2013. It is believed that Jessica was taken to a house located on Bailey St. in Norton Shores where she was murdered. The offender Jeffery Willis was arrested and charged with the crime in September 2016. The trial which called over 35 witnesses and had over 100 pieces of evidence lasted three weeks. The offender Jeffrey Willis was ultimately found guilty on both charges of abduction/kidnapping and first degree murder.


Total cruiser mileage for the month of May is 28,636.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of May 2018, the Department recorded 1,495 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 1,113 calls for service. A total of 747 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Wednesday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 6 parking ticket and 275 traffic citations in May 2018, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 72.3% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

In the month of May, 29 officers including all command officers received over 300 total hours of training.

One command officer is continuing his education by attending the Michigan State University Staff and Command school. He spent 40 hours of on-line education, where he is learning about leadership, grant writing and budgeting, and working on policy writing. This schooling is both on campus and on-line.

Four command officers and one officer attended a week long ERT training course. This training consisted of at least 40 hours of shooting, live scenarios, and shoot/don’t shoot situations. The training also consisted of classroom and firearms practice. This training is offered once a year in Grayling, Michigan.

All command and patrol officers were trained on mental health through the Michigan Crisis Intervention Awareness offered by Western Michigan University. This was an on-line training that took over five hours to complete which included a post test.

DETECTIVE BUREAU HIGHLIGHTS

During the month of May the Detective Bureau was assigned ten new cases. Five cases were cleared by arrest, warrants, or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a sex crime where a father was recording his adult daughter and her friend(s) while in the bathroom of the residence. The subject has been charged with two counts of capturing images of an unclothed person and two counts of surveilling an unclothed person.

The Detective Bureau investigated a burglary of the Marathon gas station at 2806 Getty St. The subject was identified by surveillance video. Detectives spent the next two weeks attempting to locate the homeless suspect. The suspect was located on May 24th in the City of Muskegon and taken into custody after a brief foot pursuit by detectives. Evidence was located on the suspect and he confessed to the crime. The subject was lodged and charged with breaking and entering of a business and resisting and obstructing police.

The Detective Bureau assisted road patrol on several bad check investigations involving a subject writing checks at multiple businesses within Norton Shores. The subject was apprehended on a traffic stop by officers and admitted to the crimes. A loaded handgun was found in the offender's vehicle. Additional charges for violation of concealed weapons law have been requested.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 36 arrest warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 25 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

May 30, all members of the Detective Bureau attended the countywide investigator's meeting. The meeting was hosted by Age Well Services located at 560 Seminole Rd. Investigators learned the available service through Age Well/senior resources.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 3200 block of Lemuel St. in Muskegon. The detectives seized 1.11gm of marijuana, 60gm of crack cocaine, and \$900 in cash.

The detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 2300 block of Baker St. in Muskegon Heights. The detectives seized 90gm of cocaine, 68gm of crack cocaine, 121gm of heroin, 40gm of marijuana, a handgun, and \$6,500 in cash.

The detective from WEMET assisted in the seizure of over 219gm of crack cocaine, 163gm of cocaine, 111gm of marijuana, and \$11,065.00 in cash during the month of May.
