Class A type crimes (more serious) were down by 8% for the month and down by 15% for the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were down by 29% for the month and down by 28% for the fiscal year. Total crimes were down by 21% for the month and down by 16% for the fiscal year.

PATROL

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

Patrol Division responded to a breaking and entering complaint in the 3000 block of Bailey Street. The officer arrived to find that a residential home had been broken into sometime during the day or evening when the home owner was away. The officer reported that entry was made into the home after the suspect had broken out a window. It was reported that multiple items were stolen including firearms, electronic equipment and money. The officer processed the scene which included taking photographs, finger printing, checking footprints and interviewing witnesses. The officer will continue to follow up on this investigation until all leads are exhausted.

Patrol Division responded to breaking and entering complaint in the 3800 block of Werner Street. The victim advised that sometime overnight his garage had been broken into and multiple items, such as fishing equipment, a leaf blower, power tools and car batteries, had been taken. The officer processed the scene, and while doing so observed footprints in the snow. The officer followed the footprints to an area where the stolen items were stored. These items were located at the dead end of a road in some woods. The items were identified by the victim as his. The stolen items were recovered and turned back over to the victim. The break-in remains under investigation.

Patrol Division responded to 95 suspicious calls this past month. Suspicious complaints can be anything from vehicles that appear to be driving slowly through neighborhoods, subjects parked in the neighborhoods that are not known to the residents, subjects standing around businesses that are closed, possible breaking and entering in progress involving cars, or subjects with weapons. These are usually unfounded but can be the most dangerous calls that our officers respond too.

Patrol Division responded to a breaking and entering complaint in the 3200 block of Lincoln Street. The officer met with the residential home owner who stated her home had been broken into sometime over the past few days while she was out of town. Items stolen were money, electronics and personal papers. It is believed that it is a friend of the family since there was no damage to the doors or windows. A suspect has been developed and the investigation remains open.

Patrol Division responded to road rage incident that took place in the 4600 block of Susan Street. Officers arrived to find one subject that had been severely beaten, on the ground, unconscious. Medical attention was rendered to the injured victim who was taken to a hospital by ambulance. The officer investigated the complaint and found that the subject had been assaulted because of a road rage incident that took place prior to the fight. The victim suffered severe head and facial injuries. The suspect was apprehended and lodged at the Muskegon County Jail for aggravated assault and driving while intoxicated.

February 1st, Lt Kasher attended the Coffee with the Police event at Goobers Bakery.

February 2nd, Lt Kasher assisted in the annual Norton Shores Police Department Awards Ceremony.


February 8th, 9th and 10th, Lt Kasher attended the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police Winter Conference.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of February 2017, the Department recorded 1989 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 859 calls for service. A total of 565 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Wednesday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 5 parking tickets and 159 traffic citations in February, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 63.6% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

Twelve officers, including command attended over 80 hours of training in the month of February.

Two command officers attended a 16 hour course on Low Light Firearms training. This was for officers to be better prepared on how to use their weapon and flashlights in low light situations. This training was held near Livonia, MI.

Six officers attended an eight hour Officer Survival training class that was held in Grand Rapids. This was information on how to better handle stress, de-escalate situations by talking it out and handling suicidal people.

Two command officers spent 24 hours in Grand Rapids at different seminars that ranged from medical/legalized marijuana, how to handle emergency situations (i.e., the Ferguson, MO riots), to Social Security benefits and how to attract new recruits to your police department.

Two officers attended an eight hour Legal Update training that is held every year and is mandatory to attend.

INVESTIGATIONS

During the month of February the Detective Bureau was assigned eight new cases. Five cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a larceny of a wallet at a local bar. The suspect was identified with the assistance of the bar's surveillance video. Detectives interviewed the suspect who confessed to the crime and is currently awaiting trial.

The Detective Bureau investigated an assault and child endangerment case. The charges stemmed from an apparent "road rage" incident. One party has been charged with assault and OWI/child endangerment. An investigation continues on the second party.

The Detective Bureau investigated an organized retail fraud where the offender stole clothing from local department stores and was reselling the items locally on garage sale Facebook sites. A combined investigation with Norton Shores Police, Ottawa County Sheriff, and Michigan Parole was conducted. A search warrant of the residence produced valuable evidence in the case and the offender confessed to the crime. The offender is currently lodged at the Muskegon County Jail awaiting trial.

February 15, 2017: Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended Low Light Firearm Tactics training in Livonia, Michigan.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 40 arrest warrants and seven search warrants during the month of February which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over twenty-five hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The WEMET Detective assisted with a search warrant in the 200 block of Eric Avenue. Small amounts of cocaine and heroin were seized along with several narcotic prescription pills. Over \$11,000.00 in cash was seized during the search warrant and the home owner was arrested.

The WEMET Detective assisted with a search warrant in the 3100 block of Merriam Street. The warrant produced 2.0 grams of cocaine, 2.6 lbs of marijuana, and a .40 caliber handgun. The home owner was arrested.

The WEMET Detective assisted with a search warrant in the 2900 block of 9th Street. The warrant produced 94 grams of cocaine, \$7,736.00, and two vehicles. The home owner was arrested.

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC)

The Detective for ICAC assisted New Jersey State Police in identifying a “sextortion” with the underage victim living in Muskegon County. The offender is being charged in New Jersey with manufacturing Child Sexual Abusive Material (CSAM) for the video created of the victim.

The Detective for ICAC completed a cellular phone extraction for the Michigan State Police of a person of interest in a homicide investigation that occurred in the City of Muskegon Heights.

The Detective for ICAC completed a cellular phone extraction for Clare County Sherriff’s Department for a Criminal Sexual Contact (CSC) investigation.
