Class A type crimes (more serious) were down by 11% for the month and down by 40% for the fiscal year. Class B type crimes were down by 28% for the month and down by 28% for the fiscal year. Total crimes were down by 34% for the month and down by 18% for the fiscal year.

PATROL

Patrol Division responded to 95 suspicious situation complaints. These calls involved unknown subjects sitting in parking lots of businesses that make either the customer or employee feel unsafe. These complaints also involve unfounded prowler type calls such as the home owner hearing noises but does not see anything, cars driving slowly repeatedly through the neighborhoods or checking on houses that have open windows or doors and the owners are gone. Suspicious complaint calls are usually the number one calls that our officers respond too.

Patrol Division responded to over 45 civil type complaints. These type complaints involve family disputes, neighborhood arguments, loud noises in residential areas, property disputes, juveniles causing a disturbance or unwanted customers at businesses. Usually the officers make no arrests on these complaints but it takes a lot of the officer's time when dealing with the people involved and the issues they are confronting the officer with.


Patrol Division responded to over 90 general assists complaints this past month. General assist is a non-criminal complaint that has our officer(s) assisting or helping people with broken down cars, giving directions, assisting on medical calls or checking areas for traffic hazards to ensure safety.

Patrol Division responded to over 40 traffic accidents that occurred on roadways and on private property. Although the number of accidents has dropped this past month these types of calls still are one of the main complaints our officers respond to. Most of the accidents were speed related and/or not paying attention to roadways.

Patrol Division was involved in a car accident on US31 north of Pontaluna. While the officer was investigating another accident, a vehicle headed north bound on US31 side swiped the officer's cruiser causing damage. The officer, who was in the cruiser at the time of the accident, was not hurt due to the fact that the officer had the seat belt on while doing the report. The accident was investigated by another agency and they issued a citation to the other driver that was at fault.

Total cruiser mileage for the month of March was 27,258 miles.

CALLS FOR SERVICE



During the month of March 2017, the Department recorded 2099 Computer Aided Dispatch events, including 946 calls for service. A total of 645 written reports were generated during the month. The highest number of calls for service occurred on Friday.

TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT DATA

Department personnel issued 4 parking tickets and 301 traffic citations in March, which includes those issued as the result of crash investigations. Citations were issued in 55.3% of the traffic crashes that occurred this month.

TRAINING

Both patrol and command officers had over 36 hours of training this month. This training is continuous training for our department.

Four officers attended Legal Update in Grandville, Michigan. This training keeps officers up-to-date on changes in both criminal and civil law. This Legal Update, which is put on once a year to all officers, is taught by an attorney.

Two command officers attended a one day Active Shooter Regional Conference. They are to be part of a county wide plan in response to any active shooting within the local jurisdictions.

One officer attended training for Domestic Violence and How to Better investigate and Interview the Victim.

One officer attended dive training which focused on water pressure and the consequences of rising to the surface to quick.

INVESTIGATIONS

During the month of March the Detective Bureau was assigned 11 new cases. Eight cases were cleared by arrest, warrants or other means. The remaining cases are still under investigation.

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The Detective Bureau investigated a child abuse case where an alleged assault by the father of his three year old son was report. After a joint investigation with child protective services it was determine that no abuse took place and the case was cleared.

The Detective Bureau investigated a health and safety violation at R&W bakery. A disgruntled employee intentionally placed pieces of metal in several loaves of bread. The bakery detected the metal while the bread went through the bread slicing area. The offender admitted to the food tampering to detectives and was arrested on the charge. The offender is currently awaiting trial.

March 8th, Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended the Lakeshore Human Trafficking Task Force (LHTTF) monthly meeting.

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March 9th, Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended the monthly case review at the Child Abuse Council.

March 10th & 11th, Detective Sergeant VanderStelt attended and instructed active shooter training at Muskegon Community College for the West Michigan Regional Medical Control Consortium (WMRMCC).

March 21st, Detective Morningstar attended Creating a Coordinate Community Response to Sexual Assault training.

The Detective Bureau signed a total of 23 arrest warrants and four search warrants this month which included warrants from the Patrol Division. Over 25 hours were spent at the Muskegon County Court building obtaining warrants, meeting with prosecutors, picking up and dropping off paperwork.

WEST MICHIGAN ENFORCEMENT TEAM (WEMET)

The Detective from WEMET assisted with three separate heroin overdose investigations within the city limits.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 100 block of Rotterdam. 5.4 grams of marijuana and 2.3 grams of crack cocaine were seized. The offender was arrested and is awaiting trial.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in a search warrant in the 1200 block of Frances. 24 grams of cocaine and 11.9 grams of marijuana were seized. The offender was arrested and is awaiting trial.

The Detective from WEMET assisted in the seizure of 40.3 grams of cocaine, 4 grams of heroin, 247 grams of marijuana and over \$1,700.00 in cash during the month of March.

INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN (ICAC):

The Detective from ICAC assisted in executing two search warrants in the Kent County. Child pornography was located on electronic media at both residences. Both offenders confessed to the possession and were charged with multiple felony charges.

The Detective from ICAC completed three cellular phone extractions/examinations for the Muskegon Heights Police Department reference a felonious assault and arson.

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Evidence was located on all three devices and was turned over to Muskegon Heights Police detectives for further investigation.

The Detective from ICAC completed three cellular phone extraction/examinations for the Muskegon Police Department related to a Criminal Sexual Assault complaint. Evidence was located on two devices and turned over to Muskegon Police detectives for further investigation.
