CITY COUNCIL MEETING
February 6, 2018

A regular meeting of the Norton Shores City Council was held Tuesday, February 6, 2018 at 5:30 p.m. in the Community Room, Norton Shores Branch Library, 705 Seminole Road. Pastor Doug Vandermolen delivered the invocation.

18-013 Minutes

Council Member Jurkas moved to approve the minutes of the January 16, 2018 City Council meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Moulatsiotis and carried unanimously.

18-014 Council Member Flanders moved to approve the minutes of the January 23, 2018 Work Session meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Jurkas and carried unanimously.

Mayor Nelund presented Resolutions of Appreciation for years of service to the City to former Council Member Don Martines and newly retired Building and Grounds Maintenance worker Joe Oza.

18-015 Consent Agenda

Council Member Jurkas moved to adopt the Consent Agenda consisting of a) Board of Review Representation – Council Members Beecham and Sladick; b) 2018 Board of Review Schedule; c) Authorize Bids – Engineering, Forest Park Road; d) Authorize Bids – Resurfacing, Forest Park Road; e) Authorize Bids – LED Lighting Conversion, City Hall. The motion was supported by Council Member Moulatsiotis and carried unanimously.

18-016 Planning Commission Appointment – Sheila Sipovic

Council Member Cross moved to approve that Sheila Sipovic be appointed to the Norton Shores Planning Commission for the remainder of a three-year term expiring May 31, 2018. The motion was supported by Council Member Jurkas and carried unanimously.

18-017 Zoning Board of Appeals Appointment – George Maniates

Council Member Morgenstern moved to approve that George Maniates be appointed to the Norton Shores Zoning Board of Appeals for the remainder of a three-year term expiring September 1, 2020. The motion was supported by Council Member Moulatsiotis and carried unanimously.

18-018 Introduction of Ordinance Street Solicitation

Council Member Morgenstern moved to introduce an amendment to the Code of Ordinances regarding street solicitation that will once again, if adopted, allow street solicitation within the city limits with safety restrictions. The motion was supported by Council Member Jurkas and carried unanimously on a roll call vote.

Comments: Mr. Andy O'Reily, of Roosevelt Park, informed Council that he will be running for the 91st District's State Representative position.


Alison Purgiel, Norton Shores Librarian, shared the current activities taking place at the library. Ms. Purgiel also thanked Scott Ellison and Tom Alder for setting up fourteen new computer stations, as well as two kiosks.

Mr. Gordon Gallagher, Spring Lake Township Manager, thanked the City of Norton Shores Department of Public Works for working with them, using the emergency interconnect, to keep water on for their residents while they replaced a water valve in their industrial area. Mr. Gallagher also expressed how he believes Spring Lake Township and the City of Norton Shores have a great working relationship.

Council Member Flanders inquired about updates on the HVAC work that was approved to be done at the Library. Public Works Director, Jerry Bartoszek, stated that the engineers were at the Library Friday, February 2 and were gathering the data to work up plans that should go out for bid in April or early May.

Council Member Cross inquired about updates on changes made, or that may be changed, to snowplowing. Mr. Bartoszek informed Council that at this time nothing is being done differently, they are still looking at what they may be able to change for the future. They attack major roads first to get them in good shape before doing the residential roads. Council Member Morgenstern requested that an explanation of our plowing operations be placed on an upcoming work session. Staff responded that it would be scheduled for the February meeting.
