18-038 Minutes

Council Member Jurkas moved to approve the minutes of the March 20, 2018 City Council meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Cross and carried unanimously.

18-039 Council Member Beecham moved to approve the minutes of the March 27, 2018 work session. The motion was supported by Council Member Flanders and carried unanimously.

18-040 Consent Agenda

Council Member Moulatsiotis moved to adopt the Consent Agenda consisting of a) Intersection Solicitation Permit-Child Abuse Council; b) Authorize Bids-Engineering, Lake Harbor Bridge; c) Authorize Bids-Hydrant Painting; and d) Authorize Bids-Fire Station #3 Digital Sign. The motion was supported by Council Member Jurkas and carried unanimously.

18-041 Planning Commission Reappointments – Scott Drier, Merilee Otto, Sheila Sipovic

Council Member Moulatsiotis moved to approve reappointment of Scott Drier, Merilee Otto and Sheila Sipovic to the Norton Shores Planning Commission for three-year terms expiring on May 31, 2021. The motion was supported by Council Member Sladick and carried unanimously.

18-042 Approve Participation – Pavement Marking Contract

Council Member Jurkas moved to approve participation in the pavement marking contract for 2018 with Michigan Pavement Markings of Wyoming Michigan at a cost of \$36,469.99. The motion was supported by Council Member Beecham carried unanimously.

18-043      Application for Waiver – Public Act 202

Council Member Beecham moved to approve the plan to address the underfunded status in the retirement benefit system and authorize the application for a waiver to be in compliance with P.A. 202 of 2017. The motion was supported by Council Member Jurkas and carried unanimously.

Comments: Mr. Mike Bailey, 695 Cambridge Street, distributed photos to Council Members and said that he doesn't feel the City's fence ordinance is being enforced.

Council Member Beecham reported that the Board of Review held in March went well and mostly resulted in educating property owners in assessed values. She feels that the number of appeals is less every year and it may be time to reduce the number of days the Board of Review is in session.
