

CITY OF NORTON SHORES  
CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
June 19, 2018

A regular meeting of the Norton Shores City Council was held Tuesday, June 19, 2018 at 5:30 p.m. in the Community Room, Norton Shores Branch Library, 705 Seminole Road. Pastor Doug Vandermolen delivered the invocation.

Public Comment - Agenda Items

Mona Shores Public Schools Interim Superintendent Bill O'Brien, 121 Randall Road, thanked the Council, Mark Meyers and Chief Gale for their discussion and consideration regarding policing services to Mona Shores Middle School. This will be a collaborative partnership between the Norton Shores Police Department, Mona Shores School District and the Muskegon Community Health Project and used as a model of how community agencies can work together for the betterment of the entire community.

Stevi Riel, executive director of the Health Project, Community Health and Wellbeing Arm of Mercy Health of Muskegon, expressed her excitement about the partnership with the City of Norton Shores and Mona Shores Public Schools. The Health Project is looking for ways to invest and upstream programming to help stop various health problems before they become issues, as well as, help influence different domains in community health with kids being a primary focus for change.

Mona Shores Middle School Principal Doug Ammeraal, 1700 Woodside, thanked the City for the consideration and discussion regarding policing services for Mona Shores Middle School.

18-087 Minutes

Council Member Jurkas moved to approve the minutes of the June 5, 2018 City Council meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Flanders and carried unanimously.

18-088 Correspondence

Police Chief Jon Gale introduced new Police Officer Nicholas Shevokas.

18-089 Consent Agenda

Council Member Moulatsiotis moved to adopt the Consent Agenda consisting of a) Monthly Department Reports for Police, Fire, Public Works, Administrative Services, Library and Finance – Third Quarter Update; b) Authorize Bid – Ross Park Garage Repair/Expansion; c) Authorize Bid – Parks and Recreation Garage Replacement. The motion was supported by Council Member Sladick and carried unanimously.

18-090 MPTC Pay Plan Fiscal Year 2019

Council Member Beecham moved to adopt the Fiscal Year 2019 MPTC Pay Plan as presented. The motion was supported by Council Member Morgenstern and carried unanimously.

18-091 Police Services – Mona Shores Middle School

Council Member Flanders moved to authorize executing separate agreements with the Muskegon Community Health Project and the Mona Shores School District to provide policing services at Mona Shores Middle School. The motion was supported by Council Member Jurkas and carried unanimously.

18-092 Bid Award – HVAC System, Norton Branch Library

Council Member Beecham moved to award the bid for the replacement of the Library Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) System to Hurst Mechanical, at a cost of \$475,577. The motion was supported by Council Member Morgenstern and failed on a 3-6 roll call vote with Council Members Cross, Flanders, Hylland, Jurkas, Moulatsiotis and Sladick against.

18-093 Council Member Hylland moved to authorize a re-bid for the replacement of the Library HVAC System. The motion was supported by Council Member Jurkas and carried unanimously.

18-094 2018(FY19) HMA Milling, Overlay & Resurfacing Project – Contract Change Order

Council Member Jurkas moved to authorize a contract change order in the amount of \$280,050 to Michigan Paving & Materials Company of Grand Rapids, MI, contingent upon final approval of the State budget. The motion was supported by Council Member Sladick and carried unanimously.

18-095 Sole Source Residential Water Meter Purchase

Council Member Jurkas moved to authorize the sole source purchase of residential water meters from ETNA Supply Inc. at a cost of \$149,240. The motion was supported by Council Member Cross and carried unanimously.

Public Comment – General

Tim Klein, 605 E. Farr Road, stated his concerns on the low pitch humming noise coming from a factory close to his residence. He is requesting that City Council looks into amending the present noise ordinance to have it brought up to an enforceable position.

Alan Jager, 881 Holton Duck Lake Road, introduced himself and is running as a Republican for the 91<sup>st</sup> District State House of Representatives.

Tim Breed, 3043 Chapel Ct, representing the Alzheimer's Association provided information pertaining to the launch of a volunteer recruitment initiative. Those who are interested in volunteering will receive orientation and training and will be able to go into communities to provide people with education and support groups.


Alison Purgiel, Norton Branch Librarian, gave information regarding the library Summer Reading program and events that will be held over the summer.
