19-155 Minutes

Council Member Beecham moved to approve the minutes of the September 17, 2019 City Council meeting. The motion was supported by Council Member Morgenstern and carried unanimously.

19-156 Council Member Moulatsiotis moved to approve the minutes of the September 24, 2019 work session. The motion was supported by Council Member Beecham and carried unanimously

19-157 Consent

Council Member Jurkas moved to approve the Consent Agenda consisting of: a) Annual Department Reports from 1. Police, 2. Fire, 3. Public Works, and 4. Administrative Services; and b) Board of Directors Nominee – MML Liability & Property Pool. The motion was supported by Council Member Moulatsiotis and carried unanimously.

19-158 Water Services Connections – Sole Source Bid, Northern Pipeline Contractors

Council Member Beecham moved to approve a sole source bid from Northern Pipeline Contractors of Spring Lake, Michigan in the amount of \$46,170 for the connection of eight (8) homes to the City water system due to PFAS contamination. The motion was supported by Council Member Beecham and carried unanimously.

19-159 Radar Units – Sole Source Purchase, Pulse Technology Partners, LLC


Council Member Jurkas moved to authorize the sole source purchase of ten (10) Decatur Genesis II Select radar units at a total cost of \$22,500 from Pulse Technology Partners, LLC of Brentwood, TN for use by the Police Department. The motion was supported by Council Member Sladick and carried unanimously.
